The counseling program at Southeastern Louisiana University was recognized nationally and internationally in 2001 for offering innovative study-abroad programs focusing on "cross-cultural immersion" specifically for graduate students in counseling. efforts to counselor educators and supervisors at the LACES annual conference held in New Orleans.

Regionally, the program provides qualified interns to a number of community agencies, including: The Youth Services Bureau of St. Tammany Parish, the Families in Need of Services Program, Fountainebleau Treatment Center, Fountainebleau Hospital, and Family Services of Greater New Orleans. Additionally, the Southeastern counseling program currently offers a “paid internship” for school counseling track majors under a partnership grant funded by the Tangipahoa Parish School Board, which is unique within the State of Louisiana. School counseling interns also provide counseling services to students at schools in Washington, Livingston, St. Tammany, and East Baton Rouge Parish Schools.

Program Recognition-Affiliations

Southeastern is a member of a consortium, the Coastal Restoration and Enhancement Through Science and Technology (CREST) Program, which has just been established. Its charter members are eleven public and private universities in Louisiana and Mississippi. The consortium will function in partnership with the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). It is anticipated that the consortium will receive 10 million dollars annually from the federal government for at least the next five years. The majority of funds will be distributed through a Request For Proposals (RFP) system.

The Lake Pontchartrain Basin Restoration Act: The distribution of 15 million dollars over a five-year period is projected to commence in October, 2001. The funds will be allocated through the Environmental Protection Agency and shared between Southeastern and the University of New Orleans. Although the details have not yet been determined, the funds will be dedicated to research and educational activities that relate to the restoration of the Lake Pontchartrain Basin.

Graduate student Susanne Hoepfner (Major Professor – Dr. Gary Shaffer) was awarded in 2001 an Environmental Protection Agency STAR Fellowship valued at \$28,586. Research title: Lake Maurepas Freshwater Diversion Feasibility Study.

Twenty-six biology majors were elected into TriBeta, the National Biological Sciences Honor Society. The students are required to have a grade point average of at least 3.4 and have completed at least eighteen hours of biology courses.

Board of Regents Graduate Fellowship

The graduate program of the Department of Biological Sciences was awarded by the Louisiana Board of Regents a two year \$15,000 fellowship to be presented next year to a graduate student whose research will focus on environmental science.

K-12 Partnerships

The Department of Biological Sciences is involved in a collaborative effort that involves three state universities, ULL, LSU, and SLU and three state agencies, LDE, LaCEPT, and USGS. The project, funded at \$48,600, is titled "Interdisciplinary Exploration of Louisiana Using Satellite Imagery." Southeastern faculty and secondary teachers are developing interdisciplinary lessons that will use the oil and gas industry as a theme to integrate various aspects of the state's mathematics, science, social studies, and language arts frameworks. The program will impact students throughout the state.

The Department of Biological Sciences has partnered with St. Helena Parish District through an Enhancement Grant that is funded (\$25,000) by the Delta Rural Systemic Initiative/NSF. The program is designed to develop and implement a long-range strategic plan to improve mathematics and science education in St. Helena Parish.

Business/Industry and/or Community Partnerships

Dr. Phil Stouffer, funded (\$10,600) by Weyerhaeuser Company to generate basic scientific data on the breeding birds that dwell on the Weyerhaeuser land holdings.

The Southeastern Development Foundation received a gift of \$14,000 from Robert Brown plus an Exxon/Mobil Corporation match to support the research efforts of Dr. Phil Stouffer.

Dr. Stouffer is collaborating on a research project with several staff members at the Nature Conservancy.

Dr. Gary Shaffer, received research funds (\$42,000) from MI Drilling Fluids, Inc. and the Argonne National Laboratory to utilize mesocosms as a model system to develop and test oil drilling fluids that are more compatible with the environment.

Dr. Gary Shaffer is funded (\$225,500) by Pioneer Petroleum Inc. and the US Department of Energy to assess the suitability of employing processed drill cuttings as a substrate source for wetland rehabilitation (creation and restoration).

INTEGRATED TEACHER PREPARATION

Program Recognition-Affiliations

Concluded after six years of funding in July 2001, Project CYPRESS (Communities led by Youth Pursuing Restoration of Ecologically Sustainable Systems) was a LaSIP professional development program that was reform-oriented, content-driven, and dedicated to the advancement of Mathematics and Science Education in the state of Louisiana. Project CYPRESS focused on ecology, in general, and wetlands ecology, in particular, to make natural connections between biology, chemistry, earth science, mathematics, and physics.

Project PRIME was a federal, state and Southeastern-funded LaSIP project for the improvement of the teaching and learning of mathematics in grades K-3. Project PRIME concluded after five years of funding in July 2001.

Project PRIME-IMPACT was a continuation of Project PRIME. This project brought in 20 previously LaSIP-trained teachers and 40 non-LaSIP-trained teachers for an intense summer and academic year follow-up workshops (summer and fall 2001).

Southeastern continued an articulation agreement with St. Tammany Parish School System for three hours of college credit for qualified students who have completed the Teacher Cadet academy program at the high school level and successfully completed a credit examination administered by Southeastern's Department of Teaching & Learning.

Southeastern and the Louisiana Department of Education, Division of Nutrition Assistance worked together in 2001 to publish a Nutrition Curriculum Guide for teachers of Science, Social Studies, Mathematics, and English/Language Arts in grades PK-12. The Guide included lesson plans that integrate nutrition information into content teaching and targets established standards and benchmarks for the State of Louisiana.

Southeastern and Louisiana Public Broadcasting continued to work together in 2001 on a five-year Star Schools grant from the USOE for the production of professional development materials that provided grade 5-8 classroom teachers with instructional information that integrated literacy instruction into content teaching across the curriculum. Included were video lessons, teleconferences, teacher handbooks, and a web site.

Project ReNew was a 2001 federally-funded grant designed to prepare certified general educators to work with students with special needs in inclusive settings utilizing a fast-track certification program. Grant benefits included paid tuition and stipends, mentoring opportunities, and professional development activities and materials. Because Project ReNew addresses issues of poverty in rural and urban settings, Southeastern partnered with the University of New Orleans, an urban university, to complete some of the grant's activities.

Project PREPARE was a 2001 partnership with Jefferson Parish Public Schools for general education teachers who were teaching special education classes to become certified in mild/moderate special education. This fast track program enabled teachers to become certified in four semesters, while continuing to teach in their classes. All courses were conveniently taught in Jefferson Parish or offered through the Internet.

The Early Literacy Initiative Project was designed to develop school teams for the improvement of literacy education in grades K-3 in southeast Louisiana school districts. This professional development opportunity for teachers comprised of a 10-day summer institute and follow-up throughout the academic year. In 2001, 42 classroom teachers from 15 elementary schools in an 8-parish area in the southeast Louisiana region participated in the project. The parishes/districts and schools included: East Baton Rouge (Winnbourne), Iberville (Dorseyville, North Iberville Elementary), Jefferson (Homedale), Livingston (Levi Milton, Northside, Seventh Ward, Springfield), Orleans (Thomy Lafon, Mary Church Terrell), Pointe Coupee (Upper Pointe Coupee, Valverda), St. Tammany (Mandeville), Tangipahoa (Midway, Roseland).

In 2001, Southeastern collaborated with the LDE-supported Louisiana educators seeking National Board Certification. Southeastern hosted the first support meeting that were conducted through the LDE. State Farm Insurance also a partner for the second year support these efforts.

Based on an exchange between Southeastern Louisiana University and participating school districts, the Teacher Scholars Program continued its program of working with beginning teachers while they are receiving a graduate fellowship and completing 36 credit hours toward a Master of Education Degree with specialization in Curriculum and Instruction or Special Education. In exchange, selected district classroom teachers served as Link Teachers providing support for the Teacher Scholars and assisting in the undergraduate teacher-training program.

Jumpstart Hammond was initiated in the Fall of 2001 with the mission to work toward the day every child in America will enter school prepared to succeed. The Jumpstart program trained college-student Corps Members to increase their knowledge of early childhood education and enabled them to implement the School Success curriculum effectively with young children.

Project HART (Hiring Alternative Resources for Teaching) was designed as a fast track certification program in mild/moderate special education. It was developed as a new alternative certification program. The first cohort class started in the summer of 2001. The project partners with schools in Washington, St. Helena, Ascension, and East Baton Rouge Parishes.
